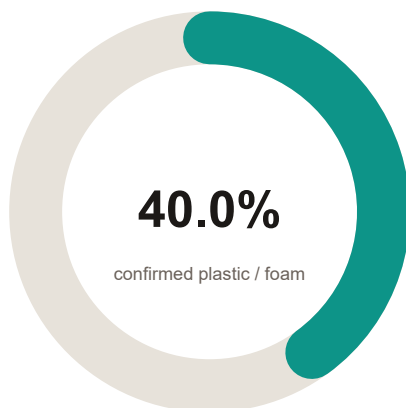

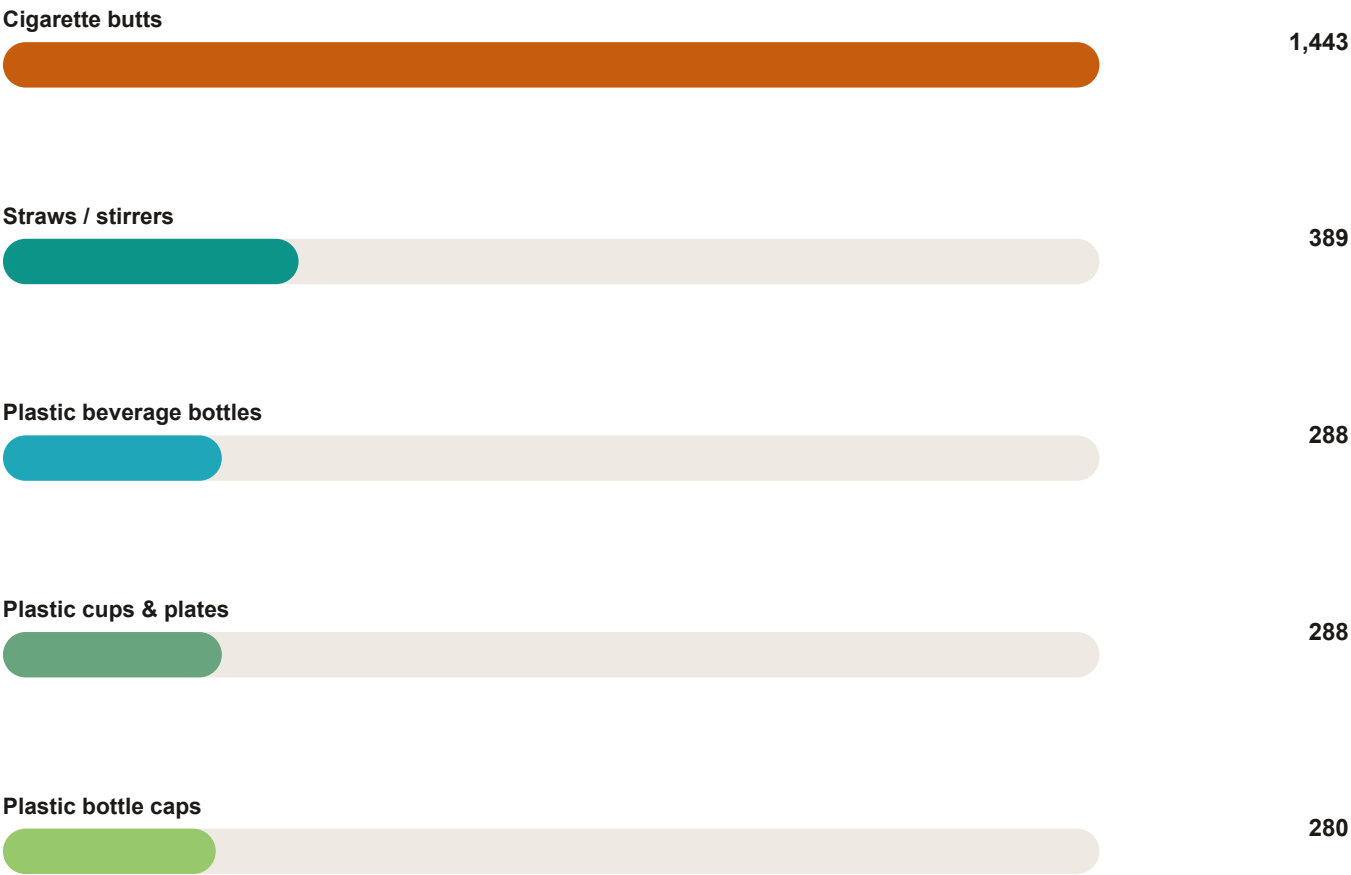

Top categories from the consolidated Ocean Trash Data Report.



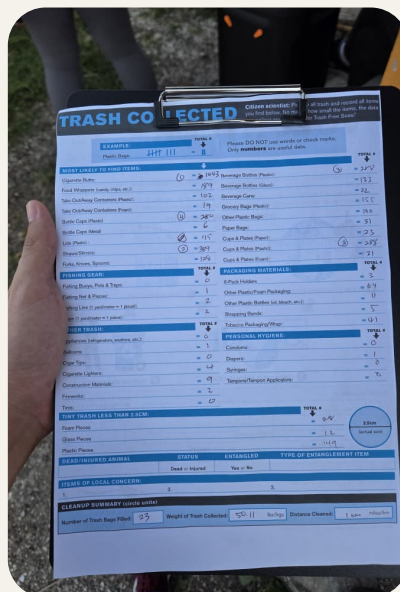
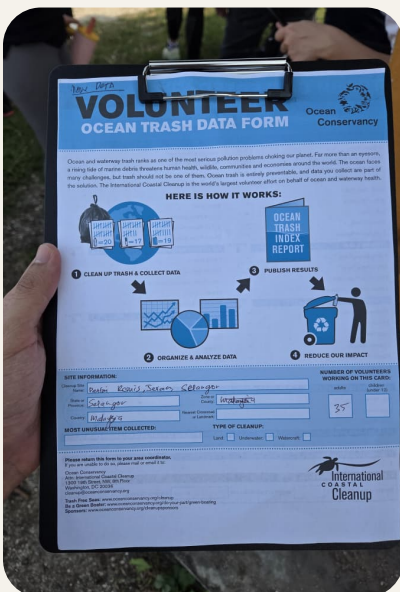
1,630 items

EXPLICITLY LABELLED PLASTIC OR FOAM

A conservative 40.0% share. Items without an explicit material label were excluded instead of being guessed.

The number is only useful when it can be proven.
